

CNCC Council Meeting: September 17th 2010 Treasurers Report

Financial Status as of 14th September 2010:

Current Account: £681.35

High Interest Account: £18,672.69

Major expenditure this period has been £91.64 for a new thermal binder (the old one went PFUFF part way through putting together an order for Inglesport). The cost includes £10.00 for next day delivery. CNCC continues to purchase resin (for the anchor scheme) and we are reimbursed promptly by BCA. Income consists of the sale of Rigging Guides and NE grants.

Cave Rescue Manual: There are 16 remaining from the original 50 purchased.

BCA Report: BCA recently held a postal ballot of its members in order to simplify the BCA Constitution. The results are expected to be announced at the October 2nd BCA Council meeting (to be held at the British Caving Library, Glutton Bridge, near Buxton)

Report to CNCC Committee 17/09/10 – **Casterton Fell Access Agreement**

So far during 2010 - 25 clubs have been issued with permits (up to the end of September) and this adds up to a total of 74 permits issued to date. Interestingly only one permit has been issued for this month and only 4 issued for this coming October,3 issued for November and 3 for December

This indicates that NO ONE is caving on Casterton Fell or we have most clubs ignoring the permit system

To date I have issued 5 permits for 2011

Report to CNCC Committee 17/09/10 – Leck Fell Access Agreement

So far during 2010/11 36 clubs have been issued with permits and given that only 40 clubs applied for permits during the whole of 2009/10, then this indicates an increase in activity. Requests for permits are currently being made at the rate of two or three a week, which is not unusual for the time of year. August was a particularly busy month with twice as many clubs issued with permits as had been the case for August 2009. Again September and October look to be busier this year than their counterparts last year.

Overall there are no problems to report at this point and there is reasonable permit availability for the remainder of the year.
